

Treatment for "Soul Hunter Kallo-Wolf"

Genre: Dark Fantasy, Tokusatsu

Tone: Gritty, Emotional, Action-packed with a touch of mystery and supernatural horror

Premise:

In a world where the boundaries between life, death, and the afterlife are thin, the Soul Hunters are an ancient order of half-immortal warriors tasked with capturing Dark Souls—lost souls that refuse judgment and wreak havoc upon the world. These rogue spirits possess inanimate objects or dead creatures, causing chaos and death wherever they go. The Soul Hunters, guided by the Creator of the Universes, must hunt them down, sending them back to the ethereal limbo known as purgatory. Among these reapers is Lycon, a once-mortal warrior now known as **Kallo-Wolf**—the Hound Haunt. Characters:

- **Lycon / Kallo-Wolf**

A half-immortal Soul Hunter with the title **The Hound Haunt**, Kallo-Wolf's true identity is Lycon, a warrior chosen by the Soul Hunters for his exceptional combat skills and deep connection to the spiritual realm. Lycon's transformation into Kallo-Wolf came after a traumatic event that caused him to embrace his role as a relentless hunter. He wields dual sickles imbued with pyro abilities, capable of freezing and burning his enemies with a unique cryo flame. His symbol is a wolf's skull crest on the back of his hand, which he uses to activate his transformation. Though loyal to the ancient order, Lycon's journey is as much about understanding his purpose in this immortal existence as it is about capturing rogue souls.

- **Corvick / Cráneo-Crow**

A fellow Soul Hunter, Cráneo-Crow, is a wind-based warrior who wields dual-bladed wings that combine into a bow. He often teases Lycon, calling him his "bestest friend," though Lycon doesn't share the sentiment, seeing Corvick as an irritating coworker. Despite their playful banter, Corvick's seriousness in battle proves his worth, and the two form a complicated but respectful partnership. Corvick's transformation is triggered when he spreads his wings wide, unleashing his wind-based powers.

- **Myra**

A human woman saved by Kallo-Wolf in the past, Myra has become an ally and supporter of the Soul Hunters. Though she cannot fully comprehend the supernatural world Lycon and the others inhabit, she stands by them, offering emotional support. Her

connection to Lycon deepens as she learns about the forces that shape his world. Her arc involves balancing her human vulnerability with her desire to help the Soul Hunters.

- **The Warden**

The mysterious leader of the Soul Hunters, The Warden, is a figure of authority, guiding the hunters in their quests. Though loyal to the order and the Creator of the Universes, the Warden harbors a shadowy connection to the antagonist, a Dark Hunter named **Black Death**, whose true intentions will unfold over time.

- **Black Death**

The main antagonist, Black Death, is a rogue hunter who once served in the Soul Hunter order but betrayed it. He wields a single-curve claymore that transforms into a scythe, representing his break from the order and his descent into chaos. His connections to The Warden remain a secret, and his plans to unbalance the afterlife's cosmic order threaten not only the Soul Hunters but the world itself.

Plot:

The story takes place in the 21st century, where dark forces and the supernatural remain hidden beneath the surface of normal life. Lycon, now a half-immortal warrior, serves as one of the Soul Hunters—elite warriors tasked with capturing rogue souls, known as Dark Souls, who escape the afterlife's judgment. These souls possess the bodies of dead creatures or inanimate objects, causing untold destruction. Armed with a cryo flame that can freeze and burn, Kallo-Wolf fights to bring these souls back to purgatory.

Each episode (or arc) focuses on a different mission for the Soul Hunters, where Lycon and his allies track and capture rogue souls. However, as they delve deeper into the mystery of the Dark Souls and their true origins, Lycon begins to uncover disturbing truths about his own existence and the Creator's plans for the Soul Hunters. Meanwhile, Black Death, a rogue Soul Hunter, seeks to disrupt the balance of the afterlife, and his ties to The Warden—an enigmatic leader of the Soul Hunters—become a slow, unraveling mystery.

Over time, Lycon's personal journey emerges as he questions the purpose of his immortality, the sacrifices made for his role, and the nature of his connection to purgatory. His bond with Myra, a human he saved from the clutches of death, grows, forcing him to confront the loneliness of his existence and the cost of his endless battle.

The Soul Lantern:

Each Soul Hunter is equipped with a **Soul Lantern**, a powerful device that can:

1. **Project the past of a captured soul**, showing their life and the reason they have ended up in purgatory.
2. **Track lost souls**, guiding the hunter to their location.
3. **Capture souls**, drawing them back into the lantern to return them to purgatory.

The Soul Lanterns are sacred relics tied to the Creator of the Universes, allowing the Soul Hunters to fulfill their mission. These lanterns are unique to each hunter and are personalized based on their abilities and role within the order.

Themes:

- **Redemption:** Lycon's journey is about seeking redemption, both for his past actions and for his role as a Soul Hunter. It explores whether he can reconcile his mortal past with his immortal future.
 - **Sacrifice and Loneliness:** Immortality comes at a price. Lycon, Corvick, and other Soul Hunters live to see countless generations come and go, while they remain unchanged. The weight of endless duty brings loneliness and isolation.
 - **Balance of Life and Death:** The Soul Hunters exist as a necessary force to maintain balance in the universe, ensuring that souls reach their proper afterlife. Yet, the Dark Souls and Black Death seek to disrupt this balance, questioning the very nature of life, death, and the afterlife.
